THE FUND

The Fund was founded in 1980 by the Trade Unions and continues to operate under their auspices. Since then it has spent more than €7,000,000 on development projects and emergency aid grants in Africa, South America, the Indian Sub-Continent and the Philippines.

The administration costs in 2008 were less than 3% of income which means that 97 cents of every €1 contributed went directly to fund projects.


Their Needs are still Great - Please Help Them

The Fund operates on a completely voluntary basis through the work of a Council, Trustees, a Management Committee, an Advisory Committee, Honorary Officers and voluntary assistance in assessing projects and with office administration.

Great care is taken with contributors' money and grants are made directly to beneficiary groups or organisations.

This project (No. 2376) is typical of many CSTWF payments made in 2008. Situated in Arusha, Tanzania, this is a training facility for young students to learn motor mechanics. *Application for €6,000 was made* and additionally, they contributed €425 of their own money. The provision of the equipment helped to improve training and involved teachers, students and their parents. Students also learned administration and inventory management skills whilst working on this project.
